Spotted Gum

Spotted Gum is a large hardwood tree that can grow up to 50 metres tall with a diameter of 1.3 metres. It commonly grows along the east coast of Australia from New South Wales/Victorian borders and extending to south east Queensland. It gets its common



name from how it sheds strips of bark as it weathers which

look spotted in appearance.

The heartwood ranges in colour from very pale brown to dark



brown with a slightly orange, green or grey tint. The sapwood is paler and more of a straw colour.

Spotted Gum has a natural resistance to termites and lends itself to being a perfect product for flooring and parquetry as it is easily sanded and polished.
