

# Tasmanian Oak

Tasmanian Oak—is not a specific tree. Tasmanian Oak is used to describe a combination of three species of Eucalypt which are commonly grown in Tasmania. They are the Alpine Ash, Mountain Ash & Messmate.

As the name suggests the Alpine Ash (*Eucalyptus delegatensis*) grows at a higher altitude, while the Mountain Ash (*Eucalyptus regnans*) grows in wetter sites. Messmate

(*Eucalyptus obliqua*) is found in both wet and dry regions of Tasmania.

Both Alpine and Mountain as are also found in Victoria (retailing as Victorian Ash) and are amongst the tallest trees of Australia.

Together these trees produce a beautiful blend of colours from very pale cream to a pink or reddish brown.

Tasmanian Oak & Victorian Ash are versatile timbers having a very straight grain making them ideal for hardwood flooring
